## Breakout Sessions

### 1 - NFPA 472 Haz Mat Safety Officer - 20 hours

**Friday, March 23, Saturday, March 24, Sunday, March 25**

Day 1 of this class experience brings to life the terminology required of hazmat responders. Responders will actually create and observe the various behaviors, and learn how these behaviors are relevant in the field at 2 a.m. On Days 2 and 3, competencies for Hazardous Materials Site Safety Officers and NFPA 472 Chapter 12 will be addressed. The officer will be provided with the knowledge and skills to evaluate a hazardous materials/WMD incident for safety and ensure that recognized safe operational practices are followed. By law, technicians can only be appointed hazmat safety officer, however any person interested in hazardous materials safety, or involved in program management, will take great interest in the concepts, objectives, and curriculum within this course and are encouraged to attend.

### 2 - Chemical Process Industries - 8 hours

**Friday, March 23**

The revised Chemical Process Industries curriculum is designed to reduce first responder injuries and fatalities during response to incidents at chemical plants, ethanol plants and refineries. This class trains first responders to use Analyze, Plan, Implement and Evaluate (APIE): A Risk-Based Response Process, and serves as refresher training for all firefighters, not just those dedicated to hazardous materials response units.

### 3 - Introduction to Explosives, Improvised Explosives, and Current Terrorism Trends - 8 hours

**Friday, March 23**

During the morning lecture, the instructor will provide information on safety and identification of commercial, military, and improvised explosives. Additionally, we will conduct several case studies involving current terrorism trends and tactics. Following the lecture the class will go out to the range and conduct a demonstration of several (7 to 11 shots) commercial and improvised explosives and discuss the different characteristics of each explosive.

### 4 - Hospital & EMS Response to Radiation & Chemical Emergencies - 8 hours

**Friday, March 23**

Hospital emergency department and EMS personnel face many risks and difficult tasks when dealing with patients involved in hazardous

materials incidents. Therefore, it is essential that all personnel who come in contact with patients have a general awareness of the issues and concerns in dealing with hazardous materials incidents. This course is designed to prepare personnel to analyze hazardous materials situations, take the necessary steps to assure medical provider safety, and identify appropriate resources for decontamination and medical care. This course alone does NOT fulfill all of OSHA's requirements for hazardous materials training at the awareness level.

### 5 - Haz Mat IQ - TOX MEDIC Training - 8 hours

**Saturday, March 24**

The HazMatIQ Tox-Medic® Course is a specialized EMS training program designed to give medics the knowledge and confidence needed to provide advanced life support to patients suffering from a hazmat/WMD exposure. This course compliments the HazMatIQ: Above the Line, Below the Line® Course. The Tox-Medic Course is taught using the same simple and street smart methods that made the HazMat IQ System a national success. Each student will receive a laminated set of Tox-Medic Smart Charts and a NIOSH Pocket Guide to Chemical Hazards.

Objectives:

1. Rapidly assess haz mat patients
2. Use hazmat reference sources to determine how a chemical harms
3. Assess the need for decon prior to treatment
4. Determine the appropriate EMS care based on chemical family
5. Identify and administer specific antidotes

This Course meets NFPA 473 Standard Competencies for EMS Personnel Responding to Hazardous Materials Incidents, including EMS/Hazmat Level 1 and 2.
