The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with ten (10) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Jordan Foltz to approve the agenda with the addition of Line 4a) Logging Recorder. Ayes (10) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Dave Weeks to approve the August 31, 2021 Minutes with the correction of Joseph Smith being the one present at the August meeting for Thomas County instead of Gary Eng. Ayes (10) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Jack Van Slyke and seconded by Diana Hurlburt to approve the August 2021 Financial Statement. Ayes (10) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Alma presented bids for Logging recorders from Eventide and Equature. The current Eventide logging recorder has been found to be dropping parts of recordings. Alma and Virginia had set in on presentation of the Equature product and also knowing that surrounding 911 centers are using this same recorder made the most sense and with a cost savings. The cost was \$24,575 delivered and installed price with annual maintenance fee of \$3300 that would begin after year one. After discussion Diana Hurlburt made a motion with a second from Jack Van Slyke to move forward with the purchase of the Equature recorder of \$24,575 and wait to further discuss the annual maintenance at year two or possibly pay on as needed basis instead. The address point layer for the towns for GeoComm 911 mapping was brought up again. It was discussed at last meeting and a decision had never been made and voted on how to proceed in handling costs. After discussion and knowing that it didn't have to be paid immediately as work had not been done yet, Jordan Foltz made a motion to send out the individual invoices and letter of explanation to each individual town/city to pay the cost for their own municipality with the exception of Seneca since it was no longer an incorporated village and would be sent to Thomas County. Tom Bandur seconded the motion. Ayes (10) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Criminal Justice Board Report: Sheriff Weeks had nothing to report.

Communications Center Report: Dispatch Supervisor/Virginia Michalski, handed out a breakdown of the statistics for the previous month. They had 1542 Check Status, 315 Pages, 265 Wants/Warrants/ Registrations, 223 Alarms, 162 Minor Detail, 125 Messages, 89 Rescue Calls, 71 – 911 Accidental/ Disconnect, 60 Traffic Violations, 53 Gun Permits, 52 Weather, 51 Assist Citizen, 35 Livestock Complaint, 32 Assist Other Agencies, 32 Fire Calls, 20 Burn Permit, 19 Miscellaneous Tasks, 18 Disturbance/ Harassment/Assault, 16 Standby for Everts/Fire/Training, 15 Reckless Driver, 14 Paper Service, 12 Accidents, 12 Check Welfare, 12 Keys Locked in Vehicle, 11 Animal Calls, 11 Theft, 9 Traffic Hazard, 8 Direct Traffic/Escort Funeral, 7 Siren, 7 Suspicious Events, 6 Criminal Mischief, 6 Motorist Assist, 6 Suspicious Person, 4 Radio Test, 4 Suspicious Vehicle, 3 Check Area, 3 Driving Under the Influence, 3 Trespassing, 2 Arrest, 2 Death Investigation, 2 Fraudulent Activity, 2 Gas Drive Off, 2 Suicidal Threats/ Attempts and 12 various other incidents. Total number of contacts to the Communications Center for the month of August was 3355 including 333 - 911 calls and 1701 Administrative calls into Dispatch.

Virginia reported on having one dispatcher out in quarantine and one dispatcher that gave a notice of leaving in a month.

Director's Report:

Alma gave notice of flu clinic that Region 26 was hosting for the public on Tuesday October 12th at 8 am for the regular flu and COVID, as well as COVID booster if available by that time and if eligible which can be determined through the Health Department.

Alma had attended the Central District NACO meeting in Kearney – and did not attend West Central due to distance to Ogallala.

The North Central PET meeting was held here last week going through the Region THIRA in preparation for grants. Alma explained the THIRA to the Board with a printout on how the Region rated the 32 core capabilities that the State has listed that helps in seeing our gaps in coverage for preparedness.

NEMA was online at the PET meeting to discuss the Crawford fire and our departments that went to assist. Alma is having NEMA come to talk to the firemen at the upcoming mutual aid meetings as why things worked the way they did and what some of our next steps need to be with the departments.

Alma & Virginia had a conference call with Motorola/ECW to determine some issues with telephone system that is no longer being supported by our local phone company and needs some upgrades even at being installed for four years to handle 911 equipment upgrades. Platte Valley was assisting with ideas of next steps.

Alma gave an over view of things being worked on and upcoming costs for the communications which included but not limited to:

Also, there was discussion of the ARPA money received from counties and if being used for the 911 Center.
