The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with nine (9) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Joseph Smith to approve the Agenda. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Jack Van Slyke and seconded by Diana Hurlburt to approve the January 25, 2022 Minutes. Ayes (6) Nays (0) Abstain (3).

Alma presented a correction to be made to the December 2021 Financial Statement to include interest that was left off of two of the Bank CDs for and was added in at \$127.62. Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Jack Van Slyke to approve the January 2022 Financial Statement with addition to the December Financial Statement. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Legislative Bill Report: Diana Hurlburt reported on information for the Legislative Hearing for LB 1194 that would be on Wednesday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>. The board listened to a couple of prepared testimonies and gathered the information on what time and where to meet up for the hearing.

County ARPA Funds: Diana had asked for the discussion for each of the counties on the ARPA funds and if any would consider funding for equipment at Region 26. Alma talked about some of the priority equipment to be considered. It was discussed to possibly send a list of things out to the county boards on those priorities.

Alma had been asked to present budget with an increased amount for the base for each counties assessment. Since it was early for this year's budget Alma presented last years budget using several different formulas. Jay asked for everyone to look these over and take to their county for review.

Criminal Justice Board Report: Sheriff Weeks was unable to attend meeting. Alma reported on the Quarterly Law Enforcement meeting that was held this month and that they were able to go over some Justice Data Solution questions and plans for training, the situation with the old recorder, reprograming for all State Radios, testing of the FirstNet coverage area and also the information that can be gathered from Rapid SOS in dispatch and what it can do for Law Enforcement.

Communications Center Report: A breakdown of the statistics for the previous month was handed out. They had 1371 Status Checks, 275 Pages, 240 alarms, 239 Wants/Warrants/Registrations, 140 Minor Detail, 85 Messages, 85 Traffic Violations, 77 Rescue Calls, 57 gun Permits, 54 – 911 Accidental/Disconnect, 46 Assist Citizen, 32 Livestock Complaint, 31 Assist Other Agencies, 31 Burn Permits, 21 Accidents, 14 Animal Calls, 13 Reckless Driver, 12 Disturbance/Harassment/Assault, 12 Fire Calls, 12 Suspicious Events/Vehicles, 12 Transfer 911 Call, 10 Check Welfare, 10 Miscellaneous Tasks, 6 Motorist Assist, 6 Radio Test, 6 Siren, 6 Standby for Events/Training, 4 Direct Traffic/Escort, 4 Key Locked in Vehicle, 4 Prisoner Transport, 4 Theft, 3 Abandoned Vehicle, 3 Burglary, 3 Civil Matters, 3 Traffic Hazard, 3 Trespassing, 2 Child & Adult Abuse/Neglect, 2 Death Investigation, 2 Driving Under the Influence, 2 Fraudulent Activity, 2 Gas Leak, 2 Missing Person/Juvenile, 2 Paper service and 6 various other incidents. Total number of incidents into the Communications Center for the month of November was 2954 including 228 – 911 calls and 1429 Administrative calls into Dispatch.

Alma reported on the new personnel that started today, the equipment installed for testing our cyber security strength, issues on not having yet enough staff. Virginia and Bailey had been doing conference calls on the new training standards to set up. At this month's staff meeting, Troy Cordle with Rapid SOS had attended giving up to date training on how the system can assist for additional 911 call-in information.

Director's Report: Alma was working with Homeland Security grant audits and an additional cyber review for NEMA. The Homeland Security projects for the North Central Region was just finalized and submitted on Friday with ten projects for the region.

Alma completed the Sandhills Task Force agreement to be sent out to the member Fire Departments for their signatures. Any call out for these Departments would go through Alma to set it up to deploy. Other areas that Alma said they were currently working on was the equipment review for renewal with NIRMA insurance. Burwell Fire was able to bring in around 35,000 sandbags for Region 26 from the Army Corps of Engineers in Omaha which we need to distribute out to the counties. The Region 26 Command Unit currently housed at the Taylor firehall is needing to be moved to a new location as soon as possible.
