The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with eight (8) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Tom Bandur to approve the agenda. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Wade Neben to approve the April 25, 2023 Minutes. Ayes (7) Nays (0) Abstain (1).

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Tom Bandur to approve the April 2023 Financial Statement. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Alma reported on the Merna Tower that nothing had come in yet from the State on the sale of tower. She had received a check from Country Partners on tower rent. Applied Connective has been having troubles with the camera connection with the Greeley tower and still working on it with the camera company. Discussion was held. Alma to send copies to the attorney regarding the Merna tower lease.

Hamilton Telephone Company met with Alma, Stena and Virginia last week regarding our telephone system we have for admin lines. The current system is no longer supported and there has been phone problems that has not been resolved. There is concern of it being compatible with the next 911 system upgrade that will be going in soon. They had discussed phone system vs hosted internet system with monthly cost and will be sending a quote. The board discussed other bids for us to look at also.

Alma handed out the preliminary budget for 2023-2024 for the board to review along with a copy of the letter just received in from NIRMA for the insurance premium for the new year that is due in June. The insurance was discussed on why the huge increase. The budget was reviewed and discussed. Jay Meyer

stated he felt additional increase in insurance should be divided equally among the member counties/city due to that being a base cost for all. Insurance to be reviewed. No decisions were made.

Criminal Justice Board: Sheriff Jepsen was absent. Alma reported that the Law Enforcement quarterly meeting was held here on May 12th. The State Patrol gave a presentation on the helicopter they have in North Platte and what they can do to help the counties when called upon.

The meeting broke up early due to the tornado warnings and reports from the counties as well as from water coming into the office from the heavy rain.

Communications Center Report:

Office Manager/Virginia Michalski, handed out a breakdown of the statistics for the previous month. They had 1448 Status Checks, 268 Pages, 224 Wants/Warrants/ Registrations, 156 Messages, 139 Minor Detail, 131 - 911 Accidental/Disconnect, 92 Traffic Violations, 73 Rescue Calls, 71 Assist Citizen, 64 Burn Permits, 49 Gun Permits, 49 Mutual Aid, 48 Assist Other Agencies, 43 Fire Calls, 38 Livestock Complaint, 37 Standby for Events/Fire/Training, 21 Animal Calls, 17 Disturbance/ Harassment/Assault, 16 Reckless Driver, 13 Radio Test, 11 Accidents, 10 Check Welfare, 10 Weather, 9 Arrests, 8 Paper Service, 8 Siren, 8 Suspicious Events, 8 Suspicious Vehicle, 8 Traffic Hazard, 8 Transfer 911 Calls, 7 Miscellaneous Tasks, 6 Alarms, 6 Motorist Assist, 5 Abandoned Vehicle, 5 Keys Locked in Vehicle, 5 Suicidal Threats/Attempts, 4 Burglary/Attempt, 4 Property Lost/Recovered/Damage/Dispute, 4 Suspicious Person, 3 Civil Matters, 3 Direct Traffic/Funeral/Escort, 3 Theft, 3 Utilities Complaints/ Outage, 3 Vandalism, 2 Parole/Probation/Protection Order Violation, 2 Prisoner Transport, 11 various other incidents. Total number of contacts to the Communications Center for the month of April was 3161 including 371 – 911 calls and 1724 non-emergency calls into dispatch.

Alma reported they had set in on a virtual meeting of State 911 Working group committee to hear what the plans were for Emergency Medical Dispatch and T-CPR to know what training will be mandatory. Dispatch has been looking into costs for any of the T-CPR training and have not found costs for EMD at this point.

Alma also reported on the telephone issues they were still having with some admin calls going to dial tone. Hamilton/NCTC has replaced a couple different things to see if it worked but the problem still comes up occasionally. The NAWAS phone had been having problems where we could not hear the State or Weather Service trying to contact us directly. FEMA had been contacted and as of this week it appears to be working okay.

Director's Report:

Alma reported on the four tornados that happened in the Region 26 counties on May 12th with one in Greeley that was an EF-0, two in Wheeler being classed as an EF-1 and EF-2 and one on the eastern side of Garfield rated at an EF-0. The winds in Thomas and Blaine were listed as straight-line winds. Hastings Weather had followed up with the Greeley tornado path the day of the storm and North Platte Weather Service met with Alma the next day to view the tornado paths in Wheeler and Garfield to help them with wind speed to determine the EF rating.

The North Central meeting was held last week virtually as well as in person here at Region 26. The trainings listed on our grants was discussed and determined what we were getting in for training and training venues. The Public Policy Center consultant is assisting with facilitating the trainings.

Alma stated that the State Patrol had come out with drones to fly over the areas of grass fires to map the burn scars in Garfield and Blaine and did take pictures as well.
