The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with eight (8) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Doug Pokorny to approve the agenda. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Jordan Foltz to approve the October 30, 2023 Minutes. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Alma reported on the Financial Statement that the Emergency Management Grant was awarded for the year for \$74,879 and added into the budget report sheet. Motion by Jack Van Slyke and seconded by Jordan Foltz to approve the October 2023 Financial Statement. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

On the PSAP funding work Diana Hurlburt reported on the telephone conversations she had with the Governor's office that we need to go through appropriations for the funding instead of a legislative bill and that it would be continued funding. It would be determined in January if a bill was needed. Diana discussed with Senator McDonnell's office and they will have a bill prepared also when needed. Ethan Clark spoke about the work he had done at the Legislature and gave points for us to consider when going to Lincoln on what we needed prepared and also about Senator's priority bills. The board discussed next steps and direction for us to work toward and the possibility of other counties coming together for a meeting to discuss this. Other Commissioners and Sheriffs are expressing the same concern for funding. Diana will work with Jon Cannon at NACO since they are making this a priority. It was determined that most of the board will be at the NACO Conference in December and Diana will see about scheduling a short meeting there with Jon Cannon. The board also asked about inviting the newly appointed Senator Fred Meyer to our next meeting so that he is aware of our concerns and what we are

working toward.

Alma reported on the quote received from Applied Connective to upgrade the security cameras. They were on premise to inspect the camera situation and determined the only the outside cameras should be replaced and reviewed the request to add an additional camera in a blind spot. The quote received was near \$10,000 and Alma said she would like to review it further to see if there are grant funds available since it would be hard to fit into this budget.

The employee Simple IRA match needed to be reviewed for renewal. Alma made a request for the board to keep the maximum 3% company match in place for the employees. Joseph Smith and Diana Hurlburt made a motion and a second to retain the 3% match moving forward. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Alma presented the letter from NIRMA Insurance for requesting the Region 26 board to sign a committal Resolution for the next three years beginning July 1, 2024. After discussion on the insurance changes and changes we need to make in our coverages, Jack Van Slyke made a motion for the Resolution to be signed with a second from Doug Pokorny. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Two Certificates of Deposit were presented by Alma that will be maturing in December and need to be changed into something that will offer better interest. After discussion on the best placement of the CD's, Joseph Smith made a motion to allow Alma to place these two CD's as they mature. Jordan Foltz seconded the motion. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Criminal Justice Board report: Sheriff Jepsen was absent. Alma reported on the recent quarterly Region 26 Law Enforcement meeting that was held with the main focus on Justice Data Solutions and having only three administrators to the system and then each Sheriff or Police Chief would only be administrator to their respective departments and not all of the Region 26 Law Enforcement system.

Communications Center Report: Bailey Lurz/Dispatch Supervisor reported on training that has been scheduled for the new dispatcher that will be mandatory basic training that he will take at Northeast Community College for a few days in December.

# Director's Report:

- Stena and Miki presented training at the Wheeler Central Schools for using 911.
- Alma, Stena and Donna attended a Thedford fire meeting to discuss communications and were able to sign up for their momentum app for viewing map of Fire and Ambulance while in service.
- The testing on T-Mobile 911 calls at each of the T-Mobile sites across the Region took two days to have 911 calls done from each sector of each tower. Their calls had been coming in on admin lines instead of 911 trunk lines.
- Alma explained the Salamander printer received in for the North Central Region that will allow us to tag all Fire trucks and Ambulances.
- Virginia has been working at finishing the point layer to our 911 map that is for all city/village
  addressing that GeoComm is updating. Most all of the towns are complete except for the City of
  Ord. Alma projected the maps up for the board to understand the addressing and how it
  appears in dispatch. There will be a large difference when complete and will give a more exact
  location with address within city limits.
